State of the Program

It is still hard for me to imagine that Thanksgiving 2015 is here. This year has flown by so unbelievably fast for me. We have covered some rich, fertile ground these last many months. I thought it might be good to stop and look behind us briefly and see what all *you* have helped us accomplish! By the time the February rolls around, you all will have taught nearly 570 different course sections in 11 different programs. God is indeed blessing Oklahoma Wesleyan University with great students and a great faculty. Here are some other numbers and what they mean:



- **84%** - Our overall retention rate this last year: AGS student retention rates continue to exceed the national average. Since engagement by and with faculty is the number one driver for student retention, this is a testimony to your faithfulness. Well done!
- **211** - The number of AGS graduates we will have had from June through December of this year. When we add in those who will complete in the Spring, that number will, of course, be much higher.
- **857** - the record number of enrollments we had this past November 2015.
- **40** - number of continual months with record enrollment

Inline grading in Blackboard lets you do this, speeding up your grading workflow. HDMI

Most new laptops come with HDMI ports. This is the preferred method to connect to our media gateways because it allows for the clearest picture and, in most cases, can transmit audio as well.

Why Demand Originality from Students in Online Discussion Forums?

Why demand originality? In relating to a traditional classroom discussion, do students respond to the professor's question by opening up the textbook or searching for the answer on the Internet and then reading off the answer? Some might try, but by asking questions the professor is looking to see if the students grasp the discussed concept, not if they know how and where to find the answer. Online students have the advantage of reflection time, along with having the textbook and Internet search engine open when responding to discussion questions. With a few simple clicks, virtually any question can



be answered by searching the Internet. Once again, why demand originality? Classroom learning takes place when students are required to think; that's a few steps beyond clicking copy and paste. [Read more here...](#)

Posting Attendance Reminder

Per our new attendance policy for AGS courses, you need to log into Web Access and post attendance/participation reports for your entire roster after the first session, as follows:



- For online, by **Monday evening of Week 2.**
- For evening, **immediately after Session 1.**

1. Go to your class in Web Access and click on the Attendance menu link in the left sidebar.
2. Click on View Overall Section Attendance.
3. For *each student on your roster*, indicate whether they were Present during the first session or Never Attended.
4. Click Save and you're all done!

Remember that for online courses, **Present** means that they completed the **Course Verification Survey** in the Weekly Lessons folder. For evening courses, **Present** means they either were actually **in class** that first night or they communicated with you in some other way **indicating their intent to participate** in the class.
